NEW APPRENTICESHIPS

(Includes Apprenticeships & Traineeships)

New Apprenticeships helps you to set yourself up for a career and possibly earn a wage while you learn. They cover just about any field of employment you can think of - from small business to multimedia and communications, sports to engineering, retail to tourism.

Part-time arrangements will also be available to school students.

New Apprenticeships can be:

- Full-time or Part-time
- Started whilst still at school
- Accessed through a group training arrangement, which can involve placement with one or more employers.

New Apprenticeships can be a pathway to further education and training opportunities, such as a university degree or other tertiary qualification.

Eligibility

Any job seeker is eligible to apply for a New Apprenticeship position. You do not have to be registered with Centrelink or be unemployed.

How does it work?

You enter into a Training Agreement with your employer. Under New Apprenticeships you and your employer have the flexibility to choose the combination of work and training that suits you both.

You carry out paid work while you are being trained. Training can be on the job or off the job, or a mix of both.

Under New Apprenticeships, traineeships are usually up to 12 months and apprenticeships up to 4 years. Some apprenticeships and traineeships can be completed in a shorter time.

The training is provided by your employer and/or a TAFE college or other training providers.

YOUTH & STUDENT SERVICES: CENTRELINK

CENTRELINK is a government agency, which handle unemployment payment, plus many other things. Centrelink previously was known as Department of Social Security (DSS).

SERVICES AVAILABLE INCLUDE:

- Forms for claiming Youth Allowance (combination of AUSTUDY, 'the dole' and of other allowances)
- Referral or information on agencies in the area eg. Health, Accommodation
- Information and referral to schemes such as 'Work for the Dole', Literacy and Numeracy program, JPET, and others
- Registration for JobNetwork (see page 5 for information on Job Network)
- They can tell you about your eligibility in regards to Job Network services
- Free resume and job search help
- A Social worker is available if you are claiming "unable to live at home' criteria of Youth Allowance (formally known as homeless allowance)

NOTE: Even if you are not claiming or you are ineligible for Youth Allowance, register at Centrelink as you may still be eligible for other services such as the Job Network. Your length of registration can effect your ability to gain free training and/or intensive assistance.

YOUTH ALLOWANCE

WHAT IS IT?

Youth Allowance is the new payment for young people who are either studying or looking for work, Youth Allowance commenced 1st July 1998. You can go from study to training to job hunting without changing payments. The Youth Allowance is a single income support payment for young people, regardless of whether they are in education, training, unemployed or sick. It replaces a number of existing payments including, Youth Training Allowance, Newstart and Sickness Allowance for under 21s, AUSTUDY for under 25s, and Family Allowance for some secondary students.

YOUTH ALLOWANCE FOR UNDER 18

From the 1st January 1999 for those under 18, Youth Allowance payments will depend on you participating in full time education or training, unless you meet criteria for special exemption, such as being ill, homeless, or unable to secure an appropriate education or training place.

WHO IS ELIGIBLE

- Full-time students aged 16 to 24
- Young people up to 21 who are looking for work full-time, combining parttime job search and part-time study, doing other approved activities (including voluntary work, or who are ill)
- Plus other criteria, check with Centrelink to determine your eligibility

When making any application you will need at least 3 pieces of ID and when applying for Youth Allowance you may need a job separation certificate if you have left a job.

MUTUAL OBLIGATION

To continue receiving benefits Centrelink may require you to participate in certain activities such Work for the Dole (see P.11), Literacy and Numeracy training (P 11), voluntary or part time work, joining Green Corps (P.10) or education or training. This is known as 'mutual obligation' requirements.

JOB NETWORK WHAT DOES IT MEAN??

Job Network replaced the CES (Commonwealth Employment Office) on May 1st 1998. Job Network is a combination of Private, Community and Government Organisations designed to help people find a job. Centrelink is the gateway to Job Network, for more information on Job Network contact your local Centrelink (see pages 3) or Job Network provider.

Job Network provides several services, these are:

Job Brokerage or Matching

Gathering employers' vacancies and matching unemployed people to these jobs.

Eligibility: To be eligible you must be registered, you can do this at a Job Network provider or at Centrelink.

You can register with up to 5 agencies.

Local Providers: Employment National, Link Employment, JobFutures, YES, Jobpower, and Leonie Green and Associates.

Job Search Training

Providing training in job search skills (resumes, interview skills etc) to prepare unemployed people to apply for jobs and give them the skills and confidence to perform well when speaking to employers. (similar to previous Job Clubs) **Eligibility:** Must be registered as unemployed for 6 months. **Local Provider:** JobPower.

Intensive Assistance

One on one help for long term unemployed and other disadvantaged job seekers to address any employment barriers and place them in jobs.

Eligibility: Centrelink to determine if eligible. Centrelink does this through an assessment tool called the JSCI (Jobseeker Classification Instrument) to determine your need for Intensive Assistance.

Local Providers: Employment National, JobFutures, Jobpower, and Leonie Green and Associates.

There are specialist Group Training Companies that concentrates on specific industries all over Victoria eg. BIGS focus on Building Industry.

There are also general organisations that mainly focus on Apprenticeships and Traineeships in a certain location eg. Link Group Training Scheme, Frankston looks at all industries in the Frankston area.

JPET (Job Placement and Training Scheme)

JPET assists young people 15 - 21 years of age (with priority given to those 15 - 19 years of age) access training and employment. JPET helps young people overcome the barriers to employment and education in a supportive environment.

The program can assist with linkages to other services that provide income support, health, housing, legal advocacy, personal counselling, drug and alcohol counselling and recreation.

In addition, skills are provided in the hospitality training facility based in Mornington. There are Computers for internet access and general use. In the near future skills based training in woodwork will be available.

GREEN CORPS

Green Corps Projects are developed by conservation and community groups and cover areas like protecting endangered species and restoring the natural environment. You spend 26 weeks in a project, doing hands on work.

You get paid between \$161 and \$269 each week depending on your age and how long since you left school. If you go into further education inside six months after the project, you are eligible for a payment of \$500.

Typical projects include endangered species, protection, fauna-flora surveys, revegetation and natural and cultural heritage restoration,

LITERACY AND NUMERACY

This program is designed to help unemployed people who have difficulties with reading, writing and dealing with numbers. It helps increase reading and writing skills. Through this program you can get up to 400 hours of special teaching, receiving between 6 and 15 hours tailored help each week.

WHO IS ELIGIBLE: Young unemployed people aged from 18 to 24 who have been on financial support for six months might be required to do this training as part of their efforts to improve their chance of getting a job.

WORK FOR THE DOLE

Work for the Dole involves young people aged 18 to 24 gaining work experience on projects that are Community based. Young people aged 18 - 20 years will work 12 hours per week over 2 days and 21 - 24 year olds for 13 hours per week over 2 days in return for their income support payment plus \$10 per week.

WHO IS ELIGIBLE: Those unemployed and registered with Centrelink aged 18-24 who have been receiving unemployment benefits for six months. Participation can be either voluntary or compulsory:

EMPLOYMENT CONDITIONS AND PROBLEMS

JOB WATCH

Job Watch is a consumer watchdog which monitors exploitation in employment and training. Job Watch assists people experiencing exploitation at work or whilst looking for work. Job Watch is a community legal centre that provides a free and confidential telephone information and referral service. If you feel suspicious about a job advertisement, an interview situation or any other work related problems, Job Watch is a good organisation to contact.

Job Watch is a good starting point if you not sure who to speak to or what you should do about any concerns or issues relating to looking for work or whilst in employment.

AWARDS, CONDITIONS and PAY SLIPS:

There are federal awards and state industry sector rates that set out your terms and conditions of employment you're entitled to receive for particular industries. These conditions can include pay rates, the process that must be followed if you're sacked, long service leave, overtime rates, and maternity and paternity leave. To check your award or to find out if you are being paid properly ring the Department of Workplace Relations and Small Business. All employees are entitled to receive payslips from their employers, if you have any concerns or queries about your payslip, or if you aren't receiving one at all, also contact Department of Workplace Relations and Small Business.

EMPLOYMENT CONDITIONS AND PROBLEMS

UNFAIR DISMISSAL

Unlawful dismissal is very complicated, so it's very important you seek specialist advice before you lodge a claim. You can ring Job Watch for advice, a private solicitor who specialises in employment law, or your union. Some employees, if they're sacked, might have legal grounds for lodging an

unlawful dismissal claim at the Australian Industrial Relations Commission (AIRC); you must lodge within 21 days of being sacked. It costs \$50. If your claim is successful, you might be reinstated or be awarded compensation because you lost your job.

UNIONS

Union membership can give you more power during employer and employee negotiations because you're part of what's called collective bargaining power. Collective bargaining power means that your employer has to negotiate with a union that represents a group of workers. It can give you more industrial support when you have problems at work, or when you're trying to negotiate better conditions, such as more money.

All Australian employees are eligible to join a union.

SUPERANNUATION

All employees in Australia must receive superannuation, except:

- Employees under 18 years old who work less than 30 hours per week
- Employees over 65 years old
- Employees who do domestic work less than 30 hours per week
- Some employees who work overseas (and a few other exemptions)

If you have never signed a form to join a super fund, and you're eligible to get super, the Australian Taxation Office (ATO) can get the money you're owed, or it can get the employer to start to pay it.

DISCRIMINATION

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Victoria's Equal Opportunity Commission can advise you about whether or not you have been unlawfully discriminated against. The Commission has the power to investigate complaints of unlawful discrimination.

You have 12 months from the date the discrimination happened to lodge a complaint.

WORKPLACE VIOLENCE Over recent years there has been a growing concern about the increased number of reports about violence at the workplace often involving young apprentices. Workplace violence is totally unacceptable. If you are subjected

apprentices. Workplace violence is totally unacceptable. If you are subjected to violence at work, it isn't your fault. No job is worth tolerating violence- your physical and emotional health are far more important than the job.

WHAT CAN YOU DO:

Tell people about it -colleagues, friends, family

Tell the employer (or manager or supervisor or the personnel department)-Ask them to do something to stop it. Ask for the incidents to be recorded. Ask for a copy of the incident report as soon as possible.

Write a journal or diary- Record the dates and times of violent incidents. Write down what happened, who did it. If possible record the telephone numbers and addresses of witnesses. Your diary could be used as evidence during legal proceedings, such as a court case.

Contact your doctor (ask the doctor for a Workcover medical certificate. Complete a Workcover claim form if necessary). Contact the police as soon as possible after violence at work so they can quickly record evidence.
