THE SUPERIOR'S LETTER

THE B.S.L. AND JAPAN

51 Royal Arcade,

Dear B.S.L. Friends,

The majority of you will have heard ere this that we are to relinquish the parish of S. Cuthbert, East Brunswick, of which we have been in charge for the last nine years. We have been compelled to take this step because of the shortage of staff. The Rev. F. W. Coaldrake, who has been in charge of the parish on behalf of the Brotherhood, has been accepted by the Australian Board of Missions for service in Japan. We have no one to take his place. It is a great sorrow to us to sever the link with the people of S. Cuthbert's, who have been most responsive and helpful. On the other hand, we feel honoured that one of our members should be accepted for such an important task as that of helping to bring about reconciliation between ourselves and the people of Japan. For many months past we have urged that preparations should be made for the sending of a Mission such as that which is now to go. We ventured to communicate with the A.B.M. on these lines over a year ago, and at the same time, we offered to co-operate with the Board in any way possible. The opportunity has now come for us to co-operate. I know you would not have us draw back. Father Coaldrake goes as a member of the Brotherhood, and will continue to live under our Rule. The Brotherhood is under no financial obligation in connection with the venture. Father Coaldrake has played a very important part in the welfare of the Brotherhood during the six years he has been with us. We shall miss him much. He goes with our prayers and blessings.

SOCIAL WORK.

The giving up of the parish will enable us to concentrate all our energy on our Social Work. Brother Coaldrake, who hopes to be ordained in the near future, was to have joined his brother at East Brunswick. He has now taken charge of the Settlement. I am to live at Fitzroy and oversee the work there. I will have with me Mr. Bishop and Mr. Wilding. I shall find myself back in the spot to which the

late Father Cox and I came nearly thirteen years ago. These changes bring their regrets, but we feel that we have been led to make them through the guidance of Almighty God. We can see some at least of our problems being solved. Since Mr. Henry left us, we have been searching for someone to take his place at Carrum Downs. In Brother Coaldrake we feel we have just the man. He is an understanding person with a happy manner, and has had just the training that is needed for a successful manager of the Settlement.

HOUSING MUDDLE NO LONGER.

I have done my share (and perhaps more than my share!) in criticising those in authority in regard to the matter of housing. I have now nothing but praise for the manner in which the new Government of this State is tackling the problem. We had a long conference with Mr. Barry, the Minister for Housing. It would seem that all that we have been urging should be done, is to be done. We feel that we are no longer a voice crying in the wilderness. I should like to take this opportunity of expressing our appreciation of the manner in which certain bodies have encouraged us to continue, in spite of opposition, with our campaign for housing. I think specially of the A.I.F. Women's Association, the National Council for Women, and the C.E.M.S. Had it not been for such organisations, and for the encouragement which always comes from B.S.L. Friends, we might have been tempted to give up the struggle. The Brotherhood takes no interest in party politics as such, but yet I would urge you to do all in your power to help the present State Government to carry out its statesmanlike policy for better housing conditions.

CHRISTMAS CHEER.

We are very grateful to all you good people who enabled us to bring happiness to our needy Fitzroy folk at Christmas time, and also to give presents to our Carrum Downs people. It would have delighted your hearts to see the joy of the poor old things of our slum corner as they sat down to the repast and as they later went off with parcels provided

by you. On their behalf I say, "Thank you very much." I know you will continue to help us to do what we can for these people and for some of the many others who come to us. Their need really is great, and in many cases, B.S.L. Friends are the only friends they have.

GENERAL NOTES

Carrum Downs.

Bro. Coaldrake is settling in at Headquarters, which until recently have been occupied by Mr. and Mrs. Haynes. The Haynes have moved into the house occupied until recently by Mr. Henry and his family. Men guests can now be put up at Headquarters. Men prepared to help with some of the many manual tasks — gardening, etc. — will be specially welcome. Daily guests, men and women, and youngsters too, are also welcomed. A cup of tea, at least, can be provided. The train which leaves the city at 12.50 p.m. and connects with the bus at Frankston, enables visitors to spend a couple of hours on the Settlement before returning to their homes.

The first of the bungalows for aged or invalid folk is about to be erected. It is to go in the area prepared by a company of Melbourne Grammar School boys, who gave up ten days of their Christmas holidays for the purpose. The area, which is to be known as M.G. Park, will be officially opened by Mr. J. R. Sutcliffe, headmaster of the M.G.S., early in April.

3XY Bungalow.

"Dorothy" of 3XY, has initiated what she calls a Bob In Appeal. It is hoped by this means to raise the sum of £250 which is the amount needed for the erection of one bungalow. We are very grateful to the management of 3XY for allowing this appeal, and also to Miss Wilby (Dorothy) for her efforts on our behalf. We are also very grateful to 3XY for giving us a free session, that on Tuesday at 11 a.m. Perhaps some of our readers may care to give at least one "bob" to "Dorothy's" appeal.
