Here second clothes are sold at a nominal price to those in need in the district. This shop does much to maintain the social service work carried out by the Brotherhood in Fitzroy.

(Clothes are always available to our social workers for those who are unable to pay anything for the same).

(a) **City, 51 Royal Arcade.**

Here an Opportunity Shop is conducted, the proceeds of which go into ordinary funds. (Saleable gifts of all kinds are always very acceptable).

(b) **Chelsea, Point Nepean Road.**

This B.S.L. Group is working to build a cottage at Carrum Downs for a resident of the city of Chelsea to be nominated by the Group.

(c) **Camberwell, Burke Road.**

This is the St. Marks Opportunity Shop. Already over £2,000 has been given to the Brotherhood for its work in Fitzroy and Carrum Downs. We understand that this Group intend to help us still further.

(c) **Camberwell, Burke Avenue.**

This is the Voluntary Helpers Shop which is supporting various religious bodies that are working for the cause of the aged. They have already given the Brotherhood

£2,000 which it is hoped will enable us to complete our Community Centre at Carrum Downs. We have been led to believe that we may hope to receive even further help from this source.

(c) **City, Swanston Street.**

This is the Commission Shop where goods are sold on commission and all the proceeds are devoted to Charitable purposes. Over £900 has been received by us for the purpose of building single men's bungalows at Carrum Downs, and for extensions at Fitzroy. We understand that the Commission Shop is to make it possible for us to build some single women's bungalows as well.

All who support in any way, the self sacrificing work being carried out by these bands of workers are helping the Brotherhood and encouraging those who are setting an example which if followed would do much to help some of the many of our social problems.
