JUST A FEW WORDS!

MUCH is said and written about slum abolition. Of recent months, many people in Melbourne have learned for the first time of the appalling conditions under which numbers of men, women and children are existing, and the edict has gone forth that the slums must be abolished. The Brotherhood of St. Laurence claim to have taken the first practical step towards the solving of the slum problem. Two years ago 50 acres of land was acquired at Carrum Downs. Cottages have been erected for about £100, and into these houses families have been removed from the slums. Sufficient land surrounds the house for the growing of vegetables, flowers, etc., and for the rearing of poultry. The parents now bring up their children in clean and healthy conditions, and the opportunities that are afforded by the natural benefits that the country offers, enables the children to grow into decent and worth while citizens, rather than a further burden on the State. Sixteen families have already been removed from the city. The scheme has been an unqualified success, having now passed the experimental stage. Some of the settlers are "off the dole." They have become self supporting and are all happy. Instead of paying from 10/- to 12/6 a week rent for houses in slum areas that are not fit for human habitation, the rent at Carrum Downs is only 5/-. The scheme and its possibilities invite your interest and co-operation.

But this is not The Brotherhood's only interest. They govern Hostels for single unemployed men in Fitzroy. Hostels where worthy men may enjoy decent living conditions, a bed and three good meals a day for only 7/6 a week. Besides this they are doing much to alleviate the sufferings of the poor.

Let Father Tucker as Superior of The Brotherhood tell you more. He seeks your sympathetic support, and is anxious to give you further details about the work and aims of The Brotherhood.
